HOW TO USE THE FAMILY WORSHIP LITURGY

Worship, fellowship, ministry, discipleship, and education all begin in the home. These liturgies are designed to be a tool for you to use in your home, around the dinner table, or whenever else you want to lead family worship.

One of the ways we suggest you start introducing family worship is by establishing a weekly 'sabbath dinner,' on a Saturday night or a Sunday afternoon. A sabbath dinner should be an occasion for the whole family to look forward to: an opportunity to feast together and to celebrate the goodness of God in your family life. Get the whole family involved: choosing the menu, preparing the food, setting the table, writing name cards, and so on. Select some music that fits the occasion, and when you're ready to begin, before you sit down to eat, that's when you use the **family worship liturgy**.

As the husband/father is the head of the household (1 Corinthians 11:3; Ephesians 5:23; Colossians 3:18; 1 Peter 3:1), it is recommended that he leads the family through the liturgy. If your household does not contain a father, then the mother should lead it. The head of the household should read the text in black and the family should respond with the text in red.

The hymn/song at the end is there so that, as the family has heard the truth of God's Word in the liturgy, the family responds in thankfulness to God with singing based on the theme of the catechism questions.

This is the basic liturgy, with simplified responses to the catechism questions, and short versions of the hymns. To help the children memorise the content, each liturgy should be used for a whole calendar month, taking 13 months to complete in all. You may want to cycle these basic liturgies a few times before moving on to the advanced liturgies, depending on the maturity of your children.



FAMILY WORSHIP LITURGY ONE



Catechism Questions (for individuals or to be done together)

- 1. What did God create? God created all things and all his creation was very good. (Genesis 1:31)
- 2. **How can we glorify God?** By loving him and by obeying his commands, and law. (1 John 5:3)
- 3. What does the law of God require? That we love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength; and love our neighbor as ourselves. (Matthew 22:37-40)
- 4. What is the law of God stated in the Ten Commandments? You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an idol. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Honor your father and your mother. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not give false testimony. You shall not covet. (Exodus 20:1-17)

Catechism Questions (for individuals or to be done together)

- 1. What does God require in the first, second, and third commandments? First, that we know God as the only true God. Second, that we avoid all idolatry. Third, that we treat God's name with fear and reverence. (Deuteronomy 6:13-14)
- 2. What does God require in the fourth and fifth commandments? Fourth, that on the Sabbath day we spend time in worship of God, Fifth, that we love and honor our father and our mother. (Leviticus 19:3)
- 3. What does God require in the sixth, seventh, and eighth commandments? Sixth, that we do not hurt, or hate, our neighbor. Seventh, that we live purely and faithfully. Eighth, that we do not take without permission that which belongs to someone else. (Romans 13:9)
- 4. What does God require in the ninth and tenth commandments? Ninth, that we do not lie or deceive. Tenth, that we are content, not envying anyone. (James 2:8)

Catechism Questions (for individuals or to be done together)

- 1. Can anyone keep the law of God perfectly? Since the fall, no human has been able to keep the law of God perfectly. (Romans 3:10-12)
- 2. **Did God create us unable to keep his law?** No, but because of the disobedience of Adam and Eve, we are all born in sin and guilt, unable to keep God's law. (Romans 5:12)
- 3. Since no one can keep the law, what is its purpose? That we may know the holy nature of God, and the sinful nature of our hearts; and thus our need of a Savior. (Romans 3:20)
- 4. What is sin? Sin is rejecting or ignoring God in the world he created, not being or doing what he requires in his law. (1 John 3:4)

- 3. Is there any way to escape punishment and be brought back into God's favor? Yes, God reconciles us to himself by a Redeemer. (Isaiah 53:10-11)
- 4. Who is the redeemer? The only Redeemer is the Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Timothy 2:5)



- 3. Why must the Redeemer be truly God? That because of his divine nature his obedience and suffering would be perfect and effective. (Acts 2:24)
- 4. Why was it necessary for Christ, the Redeemer, to die? Christ died willingly in our place to deliver us from the power and penalty of sin and bring us back to God. (Colossians 1:21-22)

- 2. What else does Christ's death redeem? Every part of fallen creation. (Colossians 1:19-20)
- 3. Are all people, just as they were lost through Adam, saved through Christ? No, only those who are elected by God and united to Christ by faith. (Romans 5:17)
- 4. What happens after death to those not united to Christ by faith? They will be cast out from the presence of God, into hell, to be justly punished, forever. (John 3:16-18, 36)



- 2. What is faith in Jesus Christ? receiving and resting on him alone for salvation as he is offered to us in the gospel. (Galatians 2:20)
- 3. What do we believe by true faith? Everything taught to us in the gospel. (Jude 3)
- 4. What do justification and sanctification mean? Justification means our declared righteousness before God. Sanctification means our gradual, growing righteousness. (1 Peter 1:1-2)



- 3. Since we are redeemed by grace alone, through faith alone, where does this faith come from? From the Holy Spirit. (Titus 3:4-6)
- 4. What do we believe about the Holy Spirit? That he is God, coeternal with the Father and the Son. (John 14:16-17)



- 4. What should we pray? The whole Word of God directs us in what we should pray. (Ephesians 3:14-21)



- 4. What is the church? A community elected for eternal life and united by faith, who love, follow, learn from, and worship God together. (2 Thessalonians 2:13)


